Fr Greq: Any of the above, or a combination thereof, is possible. Please let me explain: I myself have received advertisements from different branches of the U.S. Military, inviting me to become a military chaplain. In my case, my age and dietary needs would prevent me from meeting their requirements. A Diocesan Priest could be chosen & assigned by his Bishop. He could also decide that he would like to be one. and then approach his Bishop for permission to become one. In any case, his Bishop's permission would be required. A Religious Priest would follow the same line of thought, but instead of the Bishop, he would need his Religious Superior's permission.
