## REV. FR. DANIEL FOSU

Rev. Fr. Daniel Fosu is a priest from Konongo-Mampong Diocese of Ghana in West Africa. He is from a large family of four sisters and four brothers among whom he is the last born.

He was ordained a priest on the 6<sup>th</sup> August, 2011. Since ordination has served in various parishes, committees, councils and chaplaincies in different capacities.
